Training Objectives

The Self-Study Training Modules were designed for users of OpenLandContracts.org to independently engage with and learn more about the repository and land contracts more generally. The Self-Study Training Modules' objectives include:

- Introducing users to OpenLandContracts.org;
- Providing an overview of the repository's key features;
- Helping users to better understand key pieces of information found in land contracts;
- Providing information on the characteristics and implications of land-based investment, the legal frameworks that govern such investment, and the relevance of land contracts; and
- Exploring the benefits and limitations of land contract transparency.

Users can choose to view the slides by downloading and working through them on a computer, or by downloading and printing a hard copy of the slides.

To view the short tutorial video and complete the contract analysis exercise, users should have access to a stable Internet connection.
