

Ken Davies (戴维思)

Ken Davies is Senior Economist at the Vale Columbia Center on Sustainable International Investment under Columbia Law School and the Earth Institute at Columbia University since September 2010. He is concurrently Visiting Professor at the School of Economics, Finance and Business at the University of Durham since July 2010. Before that, he was Head of Global Relations in the Investment Division of the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) in Paris from March 2002 to August 2010. He wrote and published three OECD Investment Policy Reviews of China, and oversaw and co-authored IPRs of Russia, India and Indonesia. Before then he was Chief Economist, Asia and Bureau Chief at the Economist Intelligence Unit (EIU) in Hong Kong, after joining the EIU in London in 1992. Ken graduated in Chinese Studies at the University of Leeds in the turbulent 1960s and in Economics at the University of London in the inflationary 1970s.

GUO Jie (郭杰)

Guo Jie has been affiliated with School of Economics since 1997. He received his doctoral degree in economics from Renmin University of China in 2003. His primary fields of interest are macroeconomics, public finance and behavioral finance. He currently serves as the Associate Dean of School of Economics and Chair of Department of Economics.

Clarence Kwan

Mr. Kwan has 32 years of advisory and management experience with Deloitte around the world. Since 1989, he has been advising Chinese, U.S. and other global companies on cross-border investment, including mergers & acquisitions, joint ventures, and greenfield investment. From 1995 to 2002, Mr. Kwan was based in Beijing as the Deputy CEO of the Deloitte China practice. Prior to Beijing, he spent three years in Prague, Czech Republic, advising extensively on the restructuring of state-owned enterprises. He has also worked in Houston, New York and Beijing since joining the firm in 1978.

Lei Da received his Ph. D. in economics from Renmin University of China in 1993. He has been affiliated with School of Economics since his graduation. His research interests include World Economics, International Investment and Finance and Western Political Economics. He has also been elected as Vice President of China Society of World Economics and Managing Director of the China International Economic Cooperation Society.

Juliette Li (李楠)

Ms. Li currently oversees the Earth Institute (EI)'s research and educational programs focusing on East Asia and serves as special advisor on China issues to the EI Director. Most of her research programs focus on sustainable development, such as clean energy, urbanization and macroeconomic issues. She travels often to Asia to do fundraising and develop partnerships between EI and local governments, companies, and NGOs. Prior to working at EI, Ms. Li led the marketing communication group at a leading private wealth management firm in Asia Pacific. Ms. Li also developed and implemented a China entry strategy for a start-up fashion

publishing company, which is now one of the most successful luxury lifestyle magazines in Greater China. Ms. Li holds a master's degree in International Affairs from Columbia's School of International and Public Affairs and is currently pursuing an Executive MBA at Columbia Business School.

LIU Yuanchun (刘元春)

Liu Yuanchuan received his Ph. D. in economics from Renmin University of China in 1999 and achieved his full professorship in 2005. He is currently Associate Dean of the School of Economics and Vice-President of the Institution of Chinese Reform and Opening. He has been teaching courses in Western Economics, International Economics, International Trade Theory, and Open Macroeconomics. His book *The Market Order under Economic Transition* has won the "First Prize of Beijing Outstanding Scientific Research Achievement Award".

MAO Zhenhua (毛振华)

Mr. Mao received his Ph. D. in economics from Wuhan University. As director of the Institute of Economic Research at Renmin University of China, he also holds positions as founder and chief economist of the China Cheng Xin Credit Management Co., Ltd., President of Dong Fureng Economic Science Development Foundation, and Executive Director of the China Federation of Industrial Economics, Director of the China Entrepreneurs Forum, and Director of Wu Han University. He has published a monograph *On Systems of Capitalized Enterprises* and has frequently initiated and presided over international seminars covering finance and securities.

José Antonio Ocampo

José Antonio Ocampo is Professor and Director of the Economic and Political Development Program in the School of International and Public Affairs and Fellow of the Committee on Global Thought at Columbia University. He has occupied numerous positions at the UN and his native Colombia, including Under-Secretary-General for Economic and Social Affairs, Executive Secretary of the UN Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean, and Minister of Finance of Colombia. He has received numerous distinctions, including the 2008 Leontief Prize for Advancing the Frontiers of Economic Thought and the 1988 Alejandro Angel Escobar National Science Award of Colombia. His latest books include *Growth and Policy in Developing Countries: A Structuralist Approach*, with Lance Taylor and Codrina Rada (2009), and *Time for a Visible Hand: Lessons from the 2008 World Financial Crisis*, edited with Stephany Griffith-Jones and Joseph E. Stiglitz (2010). He holds a Ph.D. in Economics from Yale University.

Karl P. Sauvant

Karl P. Sauvant is the Founding Executive Director of the Vale Columbia Center on Sustainable International Investment, Senior Research Scholar and Lecturer in Law at Columbia Law School, Co-Director of the Millennium Cities Initiative, and Guest Professor at Nankai University, China. Before that, he was Director of UNCTAD's Investment Division. He is the author of, or responsible for, a substantial number of publications. In 2006, he was elected an Honorary Fellow of the European International Business Academy and, in 2011, a Fellow of the Academy of International Business. He received his Ph.D. from the University of Pennsylvania in 1975.

WANG Jinbin (王晋斌)

Mr. Wang received his Ph. D. in economics from Renmin University of China in 1999. He has worked at the School of Economics since 2003. He has also served as senior researcher for Bank of China Trust and Investment Corporation. His research is mainly focused on Capital Markets and Open Macroeconomics. YANG Ruilong (杨瑞龙)

Yang Ruilong has been affiliated with the School of Economics, Renmin University of China since 1990. He received his Ph. D. in economics from Renmin University of China in 1990. He has been Dean of the School of Economics since 2002. His major fields include: new institutional economics, the theory of the firm, and development economics. He also serves as a Senior Economic Advisor for the Beijing Municipal Government and Vice President of Beijing Economics Society.
